PAL is a forward-looking model for social housing, intergenerational living, and ageing in place. Our mission is to provide long-standing members of Metro Vancouver's performing arts professions with affordable housing in a vibrant and creative community setting.

## Who lives at PAL?

Founded by artists, our doors are open to people working/or who have worked in the arts and entertainment industry with priority given to seniors, persons with disabilities, and those with the greatest housing need.

## Why is PAL Needed?

The average annual income of someone who has spent their career working in the performing arts is \$20,000—less than half of other Canadians 65+.

## How is PAL Funded?

With no government assistance, PAL is funded 100% by rental income and donations.

# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

---



It has been an incredible year for PAL Vancouver. Our excess of revenue over expenses has increased by nearly 300% since 2020. This has been accomplished by a more favourable interest rate on our mortgage, a significant decrease in property taxes, an increase in donations, and better management of our overall expenses. This will allow us to carry out building improvements identified in last year's Capital Plan.

We are pleased to report that 2022 was our best year for individual and corporate donations, totalling over \$330,000, and the value of our in-kind donations came in at over \$150,000. This includes 14,000+ pounds (6350 kg) of food donated by the Greater Vancouver Food Bank, which we distribute monthly through our PAL Pantry program.

But that's not all... On June 30, 2022, the amalgamation of the PAL Studio Theatre with PAL Vancouver became official, pooling our resources into one society. The PAL Theatre is very much intertwined with PAL Vancouver, and it only made sense to amalgamate the two societies.

Looking forward, we are anxiously awaiting the opening of our second building in New Westminister in late summer/early fall. Every year, the need for housing increases, and we will be looking to add more units to our portfolio in the near future.

Again, I would like to congratulate the staff; Lynn Ross, Latisha MacGregor, Marina de Pina-Jenkins, Mike Lilley, Matthew Bissett, and Gwenda Lorenzetti on an outstanding year. The residents are lucky to have such a wonderful team working for them!

A huge thank you to our donors, partners, and supporters. Your patronage keeps the PAL Vancouver dream alive!

# EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

---



The 2022 Annual Report highlights our best year ever! Not only did we raise the most money to date, but we were also able to provide over \$150,000 of in-kind support to our residents.

I would like to thank the team at PAL Vancouver; Latisha, Marina, Mike, Gwenda, and Matthew for their hard work and dedication. I would also like to thank the PAL Vancouver Board Members for their sage advice; in particular, outgoing treasurer, Bill Cox, for his tireless work on our Finance Committee.

Improvements made to the Cardero Street building include a new capacitor bank and boiler, the installation of TELUS Fibre Optik, renovations to our 8th Floor kitchen, and the replacement of energy-efficient fridges, aerators, and shower heads for most units.

The most notable change that happened last year was the amalgamation of the PAL Studio Theatre Society with PAL Vancouver, which took effect on June 30, 2022. Not only does having one society save time and resources, but we will also be able to issue tax receipts for donations to the theatre, the heart of our organization.

And finally, we are excited to announce that PAL New Westminster will open in late August/early September 2023 with an additional 65 units of housing. We can't wait to meet our new residents and expand our impact in the community.

# TREASURER'S REPORT

---



On behalf of the Finance Committee, it is my pleasure to provide this report.

Thanks to hard work by our staff and continued support from our donors, we finished the year to December 31, 2022 in good financial shape. We achieved an excess of revenue over expenses of close to \$225,000 which dramatically exceeded expectations, due in large part to generous donations and grants received throughout the year. Overall, our cash position remains strong and our short-term liquidity is good.

During 2022, the amalgamation of PAL with PAL Theatre Society was fully completed, and the theatre operations from July 1, 2022 are now included in the financial statements of PAL.

Items on the Finance Committee's radar are the budget preparations for our PAL New Westminster property expected in the current year and planning for the Cardero St. building. Due to the uncertain timing of the completion of New Westminster, we endeavour to have this completed once closing information has been received. While generally in good shape, we also recognize that the Cardero St. building is aging and it will be important to keep it in good repair.

The Committee meets in advance of Board meetings. Responsibilities of the Committee include:

- Review of monthly financial statements and monitoring of financial position
- Preparation of annual budget and monitoring of budget/actual variances
- Ensuring that financial systems and processes are operating effectively and minimizing risk to the organization
- Controlling the relationship with the external auditor and reviewing the audited financial statements
- Short and long-term financial planning
- Considering the impact of the PAL New Westminster property

Our auditors, Manning Elliott, have provided an unqualified opinion on our financial statements.

We feel that we are in a strong financial position and able to continue to serve our community and we are excited about the future, both at Cardero Street and our upcoming New Westminster property.

I would like to thank the members of the Finance Committee for their support and assistance during the year.

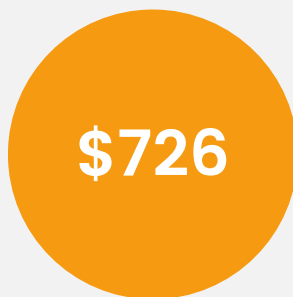

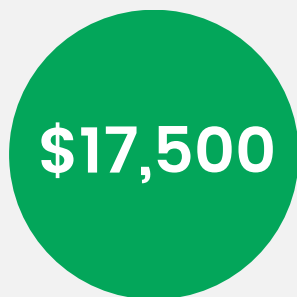

Average rent for subsidized renters

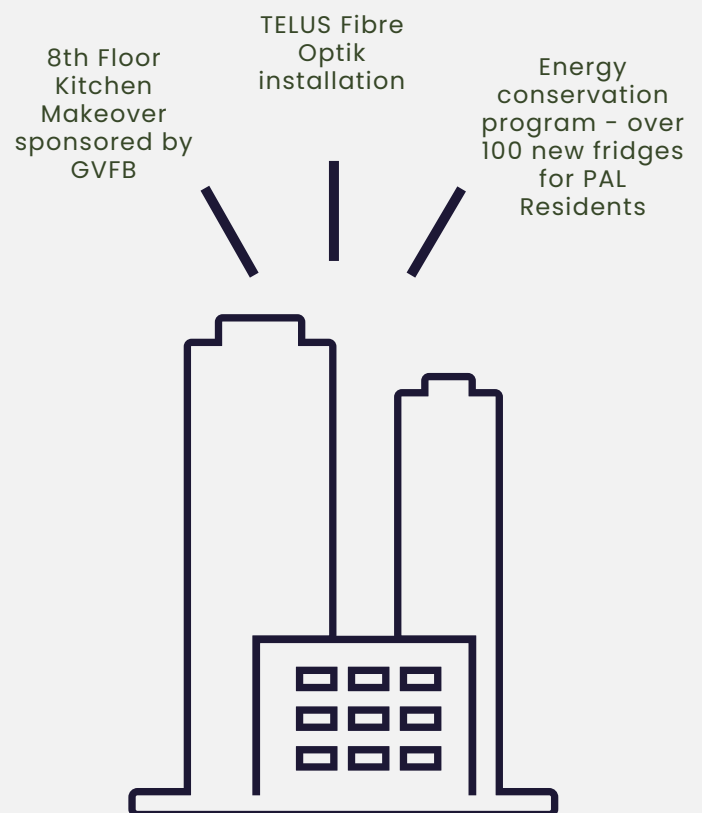


Yearly energy savings from combined building improvements

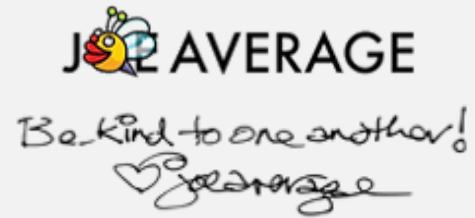
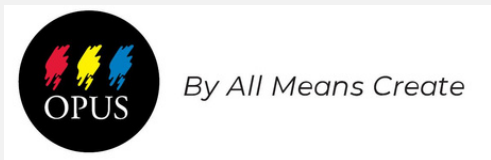
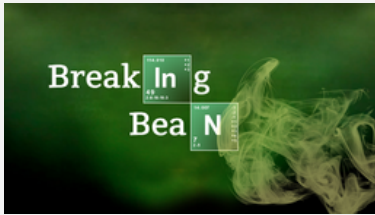
