PAL is a forward-looking model for social housing, intergenerational living, and aging in place. Our mission is to provide long-standing members of Metro Vancouver's performing arts professions with affordable housing in a vibrant and creative community setting.

Who lives at PAL?

Founded by artists, our doors are open to people working/or who have worked in the arts and entertainment industry with priority given to seniors, persons with disabilities, and those with the greatest housing need.

Why is PAL Needed?

The average annual income of someone who has spent their career working in the performing arts is \$20,000—less than half of other Canadians 65+.

How is PAL Funded?

With no government assistance, PAL is funded 100% by rental income and donations.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



It was in August of 2012 that I was contacted by my dear friend Tory Ross. She asked if I would meet her at the PAL Vancouver building to discuss becoming a member of the board of directors. I had to refamiliarize myself with the PAL building that I had not visited since attending its opening reception several years earlier. Tory and I had worked closely during her time preceding the opening of the Cardero Street building when she was PAL's lone staff person working to realize the dream of our co-founders Joy and Jane.

In the room with Tory was PAL board president Keith Martin Gordey and executive director Gary Glacken. The group was upfront with me about PAL's challenges, and that becoming a member of the board would require time and a commitment to PAL's success. It didn't take me long to decide I would join the board.

I'm sharing this bit of my history with the organization as a reminder to me in my final year on the PAL Vancouver board of how quickly the past 9 years have flown by. It also takes me back to where it began, and what we have accomplished together over the past decade.

During this time, we held our 10th-anniversary event and celebration of Joy Coghill's 90th birthday, attended by local dignitaries and the many friends and supporters of PAL Vancouver. We ensured that PAL was operationally sound and – importantly – that we were able to rebuild our contingency fund.

The new marquee sign was finally installed after many delays. Our Canada Day community celebrations came back to life, and PAL had its first-ever float in the annual Pride Parade.

Then we put shovels in the ground for our second building in New Westminster – an exciting day I will always remember proudly.

We were able to keep our residents safe during the global pandemic, and now we can see into the future when we can once again be safely together.

We also brought in new leadership with the hiring of Lynn Ross our executive director. There have been many wonderful milestones, and I know there will be many more to come.

I have so many people to thank for our successes, including our dedicated and resourceful staff. In addition to Lynn, I thank Latisha Macgregor, Karen Woodman, Gwenda Lorenzetti, and Mike Lilley for all of their work — especially over the past difficult year.

I would like to thank our valued community of donors and partner organizations, who have kept Joy and Jane's dream alive through their generous contributions while helping us to achieve our mission to support arts and entertainment professionals in our community.

Thanks as well to my fellow board of directors for all your kind support and wise counsel, and to all who support PAL Vancouver!

TREASURER'S REPORT



FINANCE COMMITTEE CHAIR: Bill Cox, FCPA, FCA

MEMBERS: Lynn Ross (Executive Director), Cal Shumiatcher, Tom Adair, Mike Klassen (Board Chair)

On behalf of the Finance Committee, it is my pleasure to provide this report.

Hopefully, we are nearing the end of the pandemic. Thanks to hard work by our staff and continued support from our donors, we look to have come through the pandemic in good financial shape.

We achieved an excess of revenue over expenses before amortization of close to \$150,000 which exceeded expectations. Our cash position remains strong and our short-term liquidity is good.

One item that is on the Finance Committee's radar is the state of the Cardero St. building. While generally in good shape, we recognize that the building is aging and it will be important to keep it in good repair. We, fortunately, have a couple of positive financial events occurring in 2021 that will reduce expenses significantly: the renewal of our mortgage at a lower interest rate and a reduction in property taxes. Savings from these reduced expenses will be used to maintain our infrastructure. Staff, with monitoring from the Finance Committee, will be working towards a long-term capital/maintenance plan in 2021.

The Committee meets in advance of Board meetings. Responsibilities of the Committee include:

- Review of monthly financial statements and monitoring of financial position
- Preparation of annual budget and monitoring of budget/actual variances
- Ensuring that financial systems and processes are operating effectively and minimizing risk to the organization
- Controlling the relationship with the external auditor and reviewing the audited financial statements
- Short and long-term financial planning
- Considering the impact of the PAL New Westminster property

You will note that the auditor's report in the audited financial statements is from a new audit firm, Manning Elliot. Our previous auditor retired and sold his practice to Manning Elliot which is a well-respected firm in Vancouver. The auditors have provided an unqualified opinion on our financial statements.

We are excited about the future, both at Cardero Street and our upcoming New Westminster property. We feel that we are in strong financial shape and able to continue to serve our community.

I would like to thank the members of the Finance Committee for their support and assistance during the year.



PAL NEW WESTMINSTER UNDER CONSTRUCTION

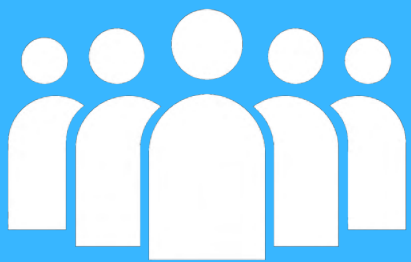

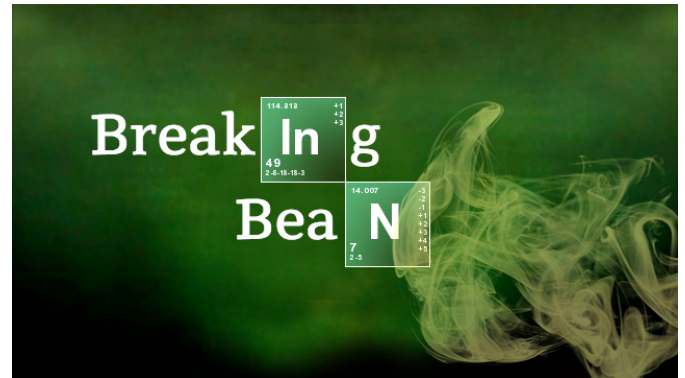
REMEMBERING GERALD LECOVIN

All theatre staff was put on temporary lay-off by the end of May.

Regrettably, this ends my term as a board member and president of the PAL Studio Theatre Board. I would have liked to finish on a happier note, but that is not in the cards. I wish the incoming board success with the future of the theatre, and I promise I will be in constant touch.

My challenge to the PAL Studio Theatre Board and the PAL Vancouver Board is to resolve the issue of management of the theatre, particularly the costs associated. 
